

**Minutes of a meeting of the Havre des Pas Improvement Group held at The Lido
on Thursday 11 June 2026 at 6 pm.**

Approval of previous minutes	No minutes to approve
Matters arising	JL delivered SG apologies, as well as delivering both his and SG's gratitude for the votes and voter turnout during the election. JL confirmed that he intended to stay on with the Parish. DW also gave his thanks, along with TC and BP.
Update from the Police	PC O'Neil confirmed that the SoJP Summer patrol program is now in place and will continue until mid-September. This included increased foot and vehicle patrols of known hotspots in St Helier, including Havre des Pas. There were 5 reports of anti-social behaviour in the last month, including damage to the toilets. PC O'Neil still encourages complaints to be reported, either by call 612612, by email hello@jersey.police.je or via the website https://report.jersey.police.uk PC O'Neil confirmed that the SoJP works closely with the Youth Service and with good information they can get the youth service to be proactive.
Update from Government and Parish Officers	IG outlined that the Parish is working on safer walking routes, especially with resurfacing of Dicq Road, for access to schools. This led to a discussion over the new school and issues around St Luke's from when IG was minister.

	• Allix's Shipyard – JL confirmed that refurbishment was being undertaken in a phased approach. AS reported that there have been supply chain issues, meaning the final bits for this phase have been delayed but hopefully they will arrive soon and before the summer. • RLS gave a history of the Shipyard, as original architect, he pointed out the names of ships built there are named around the site. As well, the planting scheme brought a plant from around the world based on where one of the named ships had been confirmed as sailing to. • Havre des Pas Seaside festival is confirmed to be held on 25th & 26th of July. JM confirmed that wrist bands would be available to residents from the Lido and that they only need to bring the letter to claim. JM also confirmed that all the access arrangements would be the same as last year, including vehicle access. • JM confirmed the next dates that the sluice gates would be opened are the 13th, 14th and 15th of July. This is to coincide with the steps being cleaned before the start of the summer holidays, meaning they would not have to be opened during. • A question was raised about the toilets being locked one afternoon, this was confirmed because of the damage caused, as mentioned by the police, and the tenant had to lock them. Otherwise the toilets will be open 6am to 8pm • JM said that if anyone wants to bring anything to their attention, either report it to staff on site or email info@lido.je • It was observed, and confirmed, that the whole bathing pool site is now licensed premises. This now means that it is easier to remove people for antisocial or unruly behaviour under the law. • It was reported that the pelican cross signal light weren't facing the correct direction, it was mentioned that it's been like this for a while. TC reminded everyone that there is the love.je app to report things to Infrastructure department, you can also email dfi@gov.je. Things should be reported as soon as possible though, if not action is taken, these can be brought up at these meetings. FYI – TC reported this to Infrastructure while leaving the meeting. • Planning application at Lucas House (Express electrics) was approved by the independent inspector and signed off by the Minister. The only recourse now is a judicial review, however, this only looks to ensure that the law was followed correctly and, even if it wasn't, the applicant could still fix any legal issue and the minister could still decide the same outcome. IG confirmed that, unfortunately, TC wouldn't be able to bring a
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	proposition to the assembly, as she looked into this around the decision at St Joseph's care home. • An update was requested on a couple of items • The crossing by Princes Bar • Haut du Mont memorial Garden • Lifeguards at the Lido • Ongoing items requested to be added to future agendas • PFAS monitoring in the water and incineration at La Collette • Shoreline Management plan and business impact.
