There is also a preview of this year's Fête de St Hélier which takes place on Saturday 16th and Sunday 17th July. The following weekend the Seaside Festival will be taking place at Havre des Pas. Residents and visitors will be pleased to see the return of these summer festivals after their absence during the past two years.

Parish staff will be busy this month keeping the Parish looking its best, with our parks and other floral displays adding to the vibrancy and colour of St Helier. The Honorary Police will also be kept busy assisting with the festival programme as well as carrying out Parish Hall Enquiries and doing other work to support parishioners.

Everyone involved in the Town Crier wishes you a most enjoyable summer with some memorable holidays, whether you are travelling away or taking advantage of all that our Island has to offer at this time of year.

RATES ASSEMBLY AGREES TO FREEZE RATE FOR 9TH YEAR

Ratepayers attending this month's Rates Assembly have voted to support the recommendation of the Constable and Procureurs du Bien Public that the Parish Rate is at the same level it has been for the past 8 years. This is in spite of an estimated cost of living rise of 6% by the end of April next year, as well as the added pressures on the Parish budget caused by the pandemic.

'The fact that we have been able to freeze the Parish Rate is a tribute to the hard work, commitment and flexibility of all our staff,' says the Constable of St Helier, Simon Crowcroft. 'We are constantly looking at how we can provide services to the public more efficiently, without decreasing the quality of the services, as well as looking to increase our non-rates income.' The Constable also paid tribute to the work provided by the Parish's volunteers, including the Honorary Police.

The Parish's auditors, Alex Picot, were reappointed at the meeting and the Accounts Committee elected, which meets several times a year to scrutinise the Parish's accounts.

HOPE FOR WESTMOUNT ROAD AND THE JERSEY BOWLING CLUB?

With the election of a new States Assembly there is a chance that the proposals for Westmount Road which the Parish has been fighting for more than 2 years will find their way into the rubbish bin!

The previous Council of Ministers had repeatedly refused to pursue the less damaging access solutions for a new hospital at Overdale that had been proposed by the Roads Committee, the Parish Deputies and the Constable, and last month the former Chief Minister had signed off compulsory purchase notices for Parish land, including

the historic Jersey Bowling Club. But with almost half of the members of the States Assembly being newly-elected, the Parish authorities are hoping that common sense will prevail, and the changes to Westmount Road will not go ahead once the new Council of Ministers has reviewed the project. Apart from the loss of the Bowling Club, the scheme would have seen dozens of trees felled, the loss of wild areas rich in biodiversity, changes to Victoria Park and the removal of more than 100 parking spaces.



CONSTABLE'S COMMENT

REFLECTIONS ON RE-ELECTION

It's a privilege and a pleasure to have been re-elected as Constable of St Helier and I look forward to the next 4 years serving parishioners. While I'm very grateful to the 3,110 voters who put their trust in me again, I'm also conscious that more than 2,000 didn't do that, and I'm particularly anxious that the work I do in the next 4 years will make at least some of those reconsider their decision! So what are the main challenges? First, our environment: as a Parish, we have declared a climate change emergency and last year started our move away from fossil fuels; I want to build on our recycling programme and reduce the waste we send to the incinerator, and I will continue to press the Government to invest in safe cycling and walking routes so that we can leave our cars at home for at least some of our journeys. Our town is short of open space and I have pledged not only to protect the spaces we have like People's Park but to double the size of the Millennium Town Park and to create a country park for the people of all ages who live in the urban area to enjoy. Second, I want to continue to create a vibrant capital for the benefit of residents and visitors: I will continue to support new hospitality and retail businesses, and do what I can to cut the red tape that makes life difficult for business proprietors and entrepreneurs. I started the historic walking tours last year and this year we had the first-ever St Patrick's Day parade through town. Events and festivals bring people into town to support our rich variety



of cafés, pubs, restaurants and shops. But how do people get to town? Not everyone can cycle, so thirdly, I will work to produce more shopper car parking on the west and northern sides of town with incentives to encourage people who need to use their cars, including disabled drivers, to come to town for shopping, a meal or a show. And I will

fight to protect St Helier residents' rights to car ownership which the planners and some politicians are trying to erode. Fourth point, I will continue my efforts to get the States to make a contribution to the extra costs that arise from St Helier being the capital of Jersey, such as public toilets and litter collection, which is funded out of taxation in the other

parishes. I want to see Government investment to match Parish funding of Neighbourhood Improvement Areas across town, and meaningful, practical regeneration schemes instead of the flagship, prestige projects the previous government was pursuing. We need a fair deal for St Helier and I will continue to work towards it.

PARISH MATTERS

ACCESS CHANGES TO OLD ST JOHN'S ROAD

On 26th January 2022, having considered concerns raised by residents over speed and volume of traffic on Old St John's Road, the Roads Committee agreed to a 12-month trial period

designating the road 'access to premises only' (closed to through traffic).

The results of the trial will be considered by the Roads Committee in January 2023.

MORE DEPUTIES FOR ST HELIER

Although there has been much criticism of the recent electoral changes, the new system has at least made the States Assembly more representative of the Island's population, with St Helier now having 14 seats (13 Deputies plus 1 Constable) in the 49-member Chamber (with one-third of the population St Helier should actually have 16 members, but the extra 3 Deputies are a step in the right direction!).

The Town Crier says goodbye and thank you to 4 former Deputies, Mike Higgins, Russell Labey, Scott

Wickenden and Judy Martin, and wishes them well in the future. 6 of the Parish's Deputies have been re-elected, albeit in slightly changed districts: Carina Alves, Geoff Southern and Rob Ward in the Central District; and Steve Ahier, Inna Gardiner and Mary Le Hegarat in the Northern District. The Southern District has 4 new Deputies: Beatriz Porée, David Warr, Sam Mézec, and Tom Coles. The Central District is joined by Catherine Curtis and Lyndsay Feltham, while Max Andrews joins the Northern District. The Parish will be holding induction meetings for the Deputies and looks forward to working with them in the coming 4 years.

Perhaps, most pleasingly, it's a welcome back to the Town Centre for Pizzeria Romana, which has reopened its doors after being devastated by fire, and I'm delighted that the menu seems to be pretty much how I always remember it growing up. To all new business owners in town at the moment, I say this - good luck, it's a tough time with current issues around labour, costs of supplies and much more, but stick at it because our town needs you.

BIG SMILES AT INCLUSIVE COMMUNITY FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT

More than 150 men and women took part in the Spoor & Fisher 4 Africa Challenge Trophy 2022, raising over £10,000 to support the ongoing work of the Jersey 2 Africa 4 Football Foundation - a Jersey-based non-profit organisation dedicated to improving young lives in Africa on and off the field through football.

The mixed teams, included the Jersey Learning Disabilities Team, competed for the Spoor & Fisher 4 Africa Challenge Trophy 2022 plus a number of other awards. Main sponsors, Spoor & Fisher, emerged victorious in the main competition after a hard-fought final with Kleinwort Hambros. In third place was the team from Aztec, while Newtel came in a commendable 4th. TMF, Sanne and Saltgate were winners of their groups, and the Crossbar Challenge was won by Alex Forbes. The Jersey Learning

Disabilities Team won the Shooting Accuracy Challenge, to the delight of everyone in the stadium, and the Fair Play Award went to the team from RBC for their excellent sportsmanship and conduct on the pitch. The other teams taking part were KPMG, Santander, JTC, Suntera and Standard Bank.

The matches were overseen by volunteer referees - two from Africa and two from Jersey - and volunteers on the day included representatives from the Jersey Friends of Africa, an organisation that promotes, celebrates and enhances the profile of African culture and Africa here. Ricky Weir, the tournament organiser and the Founder/Chairman of the Jersey 2 Africa 4 Football Foundation, said: "It was a fantastic event, and we are so grateful to all those who took part. Whilst on the face of it their lives

may seem a million miles apart from the young people we assist in the deprived communities in Kenya, football is truly the common denominator - whether it's played on the dirt fields of Nairobi or the first-class 3G surface at Springfield, as was the case this weekend. My sincere thanks, particularly, to our sponsors, Spoor & Fisher, and to all the volunteers who helped make the day tremendously enjoyable and fun for those who took part."

Chris Smith, Spoor & Fisher, said: "Congratulations to the team at Jersey 2 Africa 4 Football for organising such an enjoyable tournament. At Spoor & Fisher, we are passionate about Africa and passionate about football, so we are delighted to support such a worthwhile event. It's great that our enjoyment playing football in Jersey is replicated on fields far away through the work of Ricky Weir and his team."
