86/2022 PRESENTATION LES SABLONS UPDATE AND COMMERCIAL STREET PROPOSALS	Le Masurier team presented their proposals for the Les Sablons development, following the feedback from the last meeting in relation to changes to Commercial Street which includes the introduction of a new zebra crossing. The presentation addresses the Committee Planning Consultation comments: 1. Electric charging to be provided within all cycle stores. Bike maintenance also to be provided. 2. Bike washing facility to be provided 3. Long-stay cycle parking now provided for commercial and hotel uses (16 spaces). 4. Access for cyclists on Broad Street would be retained 5. Access to the car park will be for car park spaces only. Cycle store to be accessed from public realm. 6. Servicing will be split between Commercial Street and Broad Street. Hotel will be serviced from Commercial Street only. 7. Electric charging to be provided for motorcycle spaces. 8. Parking spaces will be for residents only and will not be sub-let. 9. Headroom clearance of 4m allowing access for refuse vehicle.

SCULPTURE PROPOSAL

create a ten-meter-high tower into which will be set 80 ceramic panels representing the 80 different nationalities that make up the Island population. The ceramic panels will not only serve to compliment the elegant façade of Ingouville House but will celebrate the diversity of Jersey's community.

There are two options, in both options the proposed location for the sculpture is to be close to Ingouville House but within the site lines of Philips Street. It is claimed that the artwork will be tall enough to be clearly visible from the end of Burrard Street and will act as 'way marker' or 'arrival beacon' positioned within a new high-quality area of public realm for residents and visitors to enjoy. At approximately 10 meters in height and 2 meters wide, there is an option to raise it a further meter with the addition of a base plinth that could be used as a seating area. The structure will be constructed in powder coated aluminium struts whose strength and integrity will be guaranteed through the application of internal welded forms.

Q How will the sculpture be kept clean?

A The ongoing maintenance would be taken on by the developer.

The Roads Committee agreed in principle to the provision of the public art sculpture in Philips Street (spiral design seemed to be the preferred option with seating), the exact position is to be agreed with Officers and will be subject to Road Safety Audits being undertaken.

The ownership, maintenance and insurance of the structure is the developer's responsibility, there is no commitment on the Parish to have to maintain the sculpture. The Parish may need to enter into a long-term lease to allow the developer to place their public art sculpture on Parish land – final details of the lease are to be agreed with Parish.

Infrastructure, Housing and Environment Officers presented the Committee with an update on the progress made with to "Public Realm Movement Strategy."

The purpose of the Public Realm and Movement Strategy is to provide a strategic framework for planning, management and development of St Helier's public realm, which is made up of its network of roads and streets.

The development of the strategy is set out in three parts. The final Stage 3 report details a clear and coordinated framework to identify issues and opportunities; to outline the nature of potential change; and to establish an action plan to support the implementation of the Public Realm and Movement Strategy (PRMS).

The strategy proposes an ambitious approach to the use and management of the public realm in St Helier and sets out how it might be improved for town residents and islanders as they move in and around it. It outlines four concepts, which have been developed to address the key public realm and movement issues and opportunities for St Helier."

The first project that Government is investigating is improvement to La Motte Street which will provide opportunity to improve the junction of Hilary Street with La Motte Street by relocating the car parking from the west side to the east side of Hilary Street, which will improve walking and cycling access.

There are currently two disabled parking spaces and one standard parking space on the western side of Hilary Street, which will be relocated to the eastern side of the road. One of the standard parking spaces would have to be lost to allow the safe re-routing of Hilary Street

Details of request:

<u>Summary:</u> Jersey Development Company (JDC) are progressing with their development of the Horizon site and have approached the Parish offering the Parish the options to adopt the proposed new footpath running along the front of the Horizon site as currently this footpath is in JDC ownership.

Committee will note that there will be a new unloading bay constructed and the footpath being offered will go around the unloading bay. This is in line with the long terms proposals to improve La Rue de L'Etau.

The extent of the footpath to be adopted is shown in Appendix 1.

Officer recommendation: Committee should consider accept the offer of the adoption of the footpath on condition that JDC provide the clarification on the points raise by officers and that the footpath is constructed in accordance with Parish requirements. All costs associated with the construction and transfer (reasonable legal costs and any necessary professional costs) are paid by JDC.

Procedures for adoption and anticipated program:

In order for the Parish to adopt the footpath the following is required:

- 1. Parish Roads Committee needs to approve the principle of the transfer and approve the proposed unloading bay.
 - Anticipate approval in principle: Wednesday 19 October 2022
- 2. If supported by Roads Committee we will take the request to a Parish Assembly once JDC clarify the outstanding items and confirm there will be no costs to the Parish associated with the construction or transfer.
 - Anticipate taking this request to Parish Assembly: Wednesday 30 November 2022


Officers have been liaising with JDC on various issues which will need to be resolved, therefore is approval provided by the Roads Committee will be subject to the below matters being agreed, clarified, and completed.

Crossing point: Position of crossing to be marked on the GA Plan. We will require the technical
paper for the crossing (which your traffic engineer should have produced) and the independent
Road Safety Audits (RSA) 1 and 2 as the Parish will need to formally request permission from the
Infrastructure Minister to install the crossing as the Parish is the Highway Authority (owner) for
Rue de L'Etau therefore all requests for changes need to come from us to the Minister.

Once the crossing is approved and installed JDC will need to undertake a Road safety Audit Stage 3 post installation as this will identify any road safety issues that may have been missed as Stages 1 and 2 (design stages). The results of the RSA are to be submitted to the Parish with confirmation that any safety concerns raised have been addressed by JDC at no cost to the Parish.

JDC Response: Please see Appendix 2 for proposed crossings GA plan. The Road safety levels 1 and 2 have been undertaken and the details amended to reflect the safety recommendations. JDC area presently consulting with IHE in relation to delivery of the works and please let me know if you have any comments in relation to this matter.

PoSH additional note: It is noted that the proposal provided by JDC are for two crossing however the crossing outside of Horizon Site is missing, JDC will be asked to also include the crossing next to the proposed unloading bay which is in accordance with the Roads Committee previous decision on a crossing point at this location:

2. **Drawings**: Please provide the plan for the area being adopted (updated GA plan) in both PDF and AutoCAD format (it needs to be saved in AutoCAD 2015 format – as we are currently using the old version). The plan is to be marked with the dimension and areas please (i.e. pavement width length and area that forms the offer).

JDC Response: We have requested the dimensioned plan in PDF and DWG (2015 version) from our consultant and will issue to you on receipt.

3. Warranty period; being offered by the contractor on the installation of the new paving.

JDC Response: This will be provided by the Contractor will be the standard 12 months defects period from Practical Completion.

4. Street lighting: If the Parish are adopting street lighting along the proposed footpath we will require details on the type, number, warranties, how they are wired and controlled, as the Parish use JEC to maintain all our streets lighting and would see this being added onto the Parish Lighting PPM.

JDC Response: This is currently being co-ordinated between your team, JEC, Watermans Civils and our Head of Design.

Following recent correspondence with yourselves (your e.mail of 21/09/22 refers) regarding lighting, please note that we are currently undertaking a review and advancing overall design for Rue de L'Etau (recognising provision for crossings).

PoSH Further comment: The Street lighting will be for a further Roads Committee decision

5. **Services**: Are there any services and encroachments under and over the footpath that we need to be aware of and who would be responsible for the services under the pavements, for example if there is private drainage runs under the pavement, I gather that it will be the responsibility of the Horizon Site or Government of Jersey Drainage section?

JDC Response: We will issue the service drawings running though the proposed adoptable pavement shortly. They will include drainage, JEC and JT etc

6. **Legal costs**: Confirmation that all PoSH reasonable legal costs will be paid by JDC in the transfer and that the footpath is being offer to the Parish at no cost.

JDC Response: We are taking advice on this and will respond shortly.

PoSH further comments: the Parish will not adopt the pavement if the Parishioners are expected to pay for passing the contract as the Parish will be incurring long terms costs with cleaning and policing, therefore expects costs associated with the transfer to be paid by JDC.

7. **Specification**: In the meantime, my colleagues will review the specification against the Parish requirements and confirm if the principle of the finishes are acceptable.

JDC Response: We look forward to hearing from PoSH Infrastructure Technical Manager and Roads Inspector regarding confirmation of the finishes being acceptable to the Parish






Appendix 2; Proposed crossing points





The Roads Committee has examined plans for the above submission and comments as follows:-

- Committee notes that proposal is for the removal of the front garden to create a car park space which will access out onto Saville Street. However, it is noted that the creation of this parking space will result on the party wall between Nos 16 and 18 Saville Street as well as part of the front wall 18 Saville Street being demolished.
