	<p>Proposer: Paul De Freitas Seconder: Jason Turner</p> <p>Jose Franco explained that he was representing Minos in Bath Street; the licence being requested is a 6th Category.</p> <p>Procureur Geraint Jennings asked (remotely) if the applicant could expand on his reasoning behind acquiring the licence. Mr Franco said the restaurant would like to offer the customer the opportunity to purchase beer and wine with their food when using a takeaway/delivery service.</p> <p>On being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>		
34/20	ITEM 5: Recommend to the Licensing Bench an application by Sangria Ltd holder of a Third category licence in respect of premises known as Sangria, Royal Square, to extend the ambit of the licence to cover on a temporary basis, as a result of the COVID19 Pandemic an enlarged area in front of their existing Alfresco, for which the applicant holds a Choses Publiques Permit.		
	<p>Proposer: Paul De Freitas, Seconder Jason Turner</p> <p>Mr Peel explained that he was representing Sangria in the Royal Square; they would like to extend their existing alfresco area on a temporary basis due to social distancing measures, as a result of COVID19.</p> <p>Procureur Geraint Jennings asked (remotely) if the applicant could confirm, if the boundary of the alfresco would be very similar to their existing layout. Mr Peel confirmed the boundary to be of a similar nature as the previous boundary</p> <p>On being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>		
35/20	ITEM 6: Recommend to the Licensing Bench an application by The Green Hill Consultancy Limited holder of Third category licence in respect of premises known as Meat and Eat, 11B Liberty Wharf, to extend the ambit of the licence to cover on a temporary basis as a result of the COVID19 Pandemic, an enlarged area, in front of their existing Alfresco.		

	<p>Proposer: Victoria Hudson, Seconder Dale Hudson</p> <p>Lisa Kennedy explained that she was representing Meat & Eat at Liberty Wharf, they would like to extend their existing alfresco on a temporary basis by approximately four meters as a result of social distancing measures due to COVID19.</p> <p>Procureur Geraint Jennings asked (remotely) if the applicant could confirm that the boundary of their alfresco area was 2 metres, as required by social distancing from the bike rack, which is near the premises. Lisa Kennedy confirmed that it was at least two metres from the boundary.</p> <p>On being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously.</p>
	<p>The Constable reminded all those that had spoken in respect of the Licensing applications that they were entitled to address the Licensing Assembly, which would sit at 10:00am Thursday 18 June to hear the applications. Anyone listening at home who would like to address the Licensing Bench would need to give at least 7 days written notification to the Judicial Greffier of the fact they wish to apply to be heard in person or by a solicitor and the Licensing Bench may at its absolute discretion hear from them or their representative</p>
