	<p>Proposer: Jose Rodrigues, Seconder: Mario Carvalho</p> <p>The application was presented by Advocate Christopher Scholefield, who explained the company is applying for 1st & 3rd category licences for the premises Mira, located on both Halkett Place and Burrard Street, but which is better known as the premises that wraps around Bean Around the World coffee shop.</p> <p>Although the application is classed as a new licence, the restaurant has held a liquor licence for many years. The previous owner has sold the business to Jorge De Freitas, the liquor licence was previously in the owner's name, whereas this application is for the licence to be in the company name. The applicant has requested that the licence be extended to cover an outside alfresco area in Halkett Place.</p> <p>The restaurant opens for both lunch and dinner with the kitchen closing at 9.30pm. It is not envisaged that there will be any concerns to parishioners living nearby, as there has not in the past been any matters brought to the attention of the Authorities. Mr De Freitas will be the licenced manager, he has many years' experience of managing liquor licences, a 4th category in a Hotel environment and a 1st & 3rd at local bars and restaurants. He is a teacher of catering at Highlands and so the Assembly can be assured the licence is in safe hands. The applicant would like to express his thanks to the Constable for enabling this application to be heard, as the next six weeks of business are very important to the restaurant.</p> <p>Procureur Jennings asked the applicant to confirm if both 1st and 3rd category licences would be extended to cover the alfresco area. The applicant confirmed he would appreciate if that could be the case.</p> <p>Procureur Jennings asked what hours the alfresco area would operate. The applicant advised they would be the same as the current hours, 8am to 10pm.</p> <p>There were no further questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously.</p>		
	<p>The Constable advised the Assembly that anyone who had spoken in respect of the Licensing application, was entitled to address an extraordinary sitting of the Licensing Assembly, which would sit at 9.15am on Monday 21st November, to hear the application.</p>
