	<p>Proposer: Jean Treleven, Seconder: Michael Tait</p> <p>Bryony Bowen-Price presented an application on behalf of the Potato Shack, explaining that a small roadside stall had now been developed to include a café, therefore she is seeking to apply for a 3rd Category Licence.</p> <p>Although the café has regular opening hours, the business would like the flexibility to operate as an evening dining venue for various events and celebrations.</p> <p>Mrs Bowen-Price requested that the license be extended to cover the outside area.</p> <p>On being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>

Previously, the Casual Dinning Company operated the premises but they have unfortunately gone into administration.</p> <p>As a result, Jersey Pottery (Overseas) Limited have taken over the food and beverage operation at Jersey Airport and recently have been granted approval to operate the Harbour facilities. They are planning to open from the 1st March and will be offering both food and drink to travelling and non-traveling customers.
