	<p><b>Proposer:</b> Dexter Flynn, <b>Seconder:</b> Matthew Ryan</p> <p>Mr Boothman confirmed that he was representing La Bouche in the Central Market. The licence requested is a 6<sup>th</sup> Category, the restaurant has been forced to close because of COVID and social distancing and this is a way or restarting the business. Before Covid a sizable part of their takings were from alcohol sales and they would like to offer the customer the opportunity to purchase beer and wine with their food. La Bouche operate the Challenge 25 system on the premises and their waiters who are the delivery drivers are trained in this, if there are any concerns the alcohol is returned to the restaurant and the matter reported to the manager; they asked the Assembly to support their application.</p> <p>On being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>

	<p><b>Proposer:</b> Laurence Curtis, <b>Seconder:</b> Alex Curtis</p> <p>The applicant explained that since 2018 they had been operating a 6<sup>th</sup> category licence for their wine shop and then gradually building up the business to hold a 1st category licence and alfresco area. They are seeking a 3<sup>rd</sup> category licence this evening, due to positive results. The business would like this licence to provide a fuller offering of Italian style sharing plates. Inspections by Fire and Environmental Health are satisfactory.</p> <p>On being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>

<p><b>Proposer:</b> Alex Curtis, <b>Secunder:</b> Laurence Curtis</p> <p>The applicant stated they had been operating a 6<sup>th</sup> category licence since 2016, as a distillery from an address in St Clement. Their product is genuine Jersey gin and vodka, which they sell to the retail and hospitality trade. They are looking for a 6<sup>th</sup> category licence to sell as a retail offering from a property 11 La Motte Street as well as continuing to supply their trade customers and introduce online sales.</p> <p>No questions were asked and on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>

<p><b>Proposer:</b> Alex Curtis, <b>Secunder:</b> Laurence Curtis</p> <p>The applicant would like a 1<sup>st</sup> category licence to sell their range of local products on a flexible basis to customers, being the general public and specialist groups. Fire and Environmental Health have both been involved with the application.</p> <p>The Constable asked what the capacity of the building is; he was advised that Environmental Health have stated 25 and Fire Service have stated 32. The applicant explained they do not yet have a number that would include a social distancing approach, as they have not fully completed their current plan of works.</p> <p>No questions were asked and on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>

<p><b>Proposer:</b> Laurence Curtis, <b>Secunder:</b> Alex Curtis</p> <p>The applicant explained Carob Ltd had held a 6<sup>th</sup> category licence previously. A couple of years ago they moved from a property in St Saviour to a warehouse in St Helier and they would now like to extend their lines by operating online sales to the retail sector,</p> <p>On being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>

<p><b>Proposer:</b> Laurence Curtis, <b>Secunder:</b> Alex Curtis</p> <p>Orderit is a new online supermarket that has started up a couple of months ago. The company would like to extend its offering after seeing a demand grow massively for its online product. Deliveries will be to named customers and delivery drivers will be trained to take photographic ID from the Customer before supplying the alcohol</p> <p>On being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>

<p><b>Proposer:</b> Laurence Curtis, <b>Secunder:</b> Alex Curtis</p> <p>Project Number 1 would like a 6<sup>th</sup> Category licence for the Clean Wine Group, which is a wholesale and retail business supplying natural wine from all over the world for the local market. Organic and natural wines are better for consumers and the planet.</p> <p>We would like to offer a delivery service, where customers can browse the products we supply from our website and social chat forums. Online orders will be taken through the website, we would also like to</p>		

	<p>offer a tick and collect service. Customers will be required to confirm that they are over 18 years of age.</p> <p>On being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>

	<p><b>Proposer:</b> Laurence Curtis, <b>Seconder</b> Alex Curtis</p> <p>The applicant explained they have recently acquired the property next door and whilst deciding what to do with the interior, they have decided to extend their current alfresco area, as the Bastille has always had a shortfall in its alfresco provision. This extension will allow them to provide an additional 20 covers. They currently have alfresco areas at both the front and back of the property and these areas have been well received since they have recently reopened. The ambience for local residents in the area has vastly improved with alfresco opportunities becoming available,</p> <p>On being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p> <p>The applicant said a big thank you to the Parish, both at administration level and honorary level for the work they have been doing, it has been fantastic and supportive of business and hospitality sector. The Constable thanked him for his feedback and said he would pass the feedback on to those concerned</p>
