14/23	Item 2: In conformity with Article 5 of the Loi (1914) sur la Voirie, to elect one member of the Roads Committee to complete a term of office expiring on 31st December 2023;

18/23	Item 6: To approve a recommendation of the Roads Committee and Procureurs du Bien Public to accept a gift of a section of land alongside Claremont House, Tower Road, for the purpose of widening the existing public footpath. The Assembly is to instruct the Connétable and at least one Procureur du Bien Public to pass a contract, with the owner paying all reasonable legal costs associated with the transfer. P.02/2023*;
	Proposer: Peter Pearce Seconder: Geraint Jennings
	Silvio Alves, Head of Infrastructure took the Assembly through the Projet.
	Alison Baker questioned why the land holder is expected to not only give the land to the Parish but also to pay the legal costs. Geraint Jennings explained that the Parish had been over a number of years endeavouring to create a pavement along the whole of Tower Road and the requirements on the applicant are part of the planning obligation agreement, put in place by the Government Planning Department.
	Johannah Hartigan asked if in future Tower Road would become one way. Silvio Alves confirmed there were currently no plans for that to happen.
	James Corbett sought clarification that the extension of the pavement would not narrow the existing road. Silvio Alves confirmed that by the accepting the Projet this would not impact on the width of the road.
	There were no further questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the proposition was approved unanimously.
