	<p>Proposer: Erlinda Carter Seconder: Paul Carter</p> <p>Erlinda Carter spoke on behalf of a 6th category licence application, explaining this is a new venture and that the shop would be open from 9am until 9pm daily.</p> <p>There were no questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote there was 1 abstention and 20 votes in favour of the application.</p>

	Cecilia Da Silva Pestana	3rd	Funchal Paradise Restaurant 68b La Colomberie
	<p>Proposer: Joaquim Esteves, Seconder: Manuel Rodrigues De Silva</p> <p>Advocate Philip Syvret, from law firm Benest and Syvret spoke on behalf of a 3rd category licence application for Funchal Paradise. This is a transfer of a licence, as the previous owners have held a licence for the premises since 2008 and it is intended that the restaurant will be run in a similar manner. Both Mrs Da Silva and her partner have experience of working within a restaurant and holding a liquor licence, Mrs Da Silva will be front of house and her partner will be the chef. Alcohol will be served with meals between the hours of 9am to 1am, and those not partaking of meals will need to be seated to be served alcohol up until the hours of 11pm</p> <p>There were no questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>		
	Great Western Hotel Limited Korina Powell (Sec)	1st & 7th	Troubadour 7 Caledonia Place
	<p>Proposer: Keith O'Connor Seconder: Cosmin Luca</p> <p>Korina Powell, Secretary for the Liberation Group spoke on behalf of an application for 1st and 7th category licences, for the premises known as Troubadour which is owned by the Company. The pub is intended to run in a similar manner as it does currently Live music will be played at the rear of the premises and other entertainment, will take place, including quizzes and bingo. The hours of opening will be from 11am to 11pm and the company would request the licence be extended to cover the external alfresco area which is on private land.</p> <p>Ian Gray asked if the premises currently hold a 7th category licence. Korina Powell confirmed that it does. The</p>

	Sarah Glendewar spoke on behalf of an application for a 3rd category licence for Eddies Chip Shop. The licence is required to sell alcohol with meals. The shop will be open daily for meals from 12noon to 12 midnight.

	San Remo (Restaurant) Limited Rosscot Secretaries Limited (Sec)	6th Little Italy 36-38 Kensington Place
	Proposer: Ian Le Vesconte Seconder: Colin Taylor	
	Ian Le Vesconte spoke on behalf of an application for a 6th category licence for Little Italy. He explained that he planned to bring into the Island a specific beer from Italy. He would be required to purchase two pallets of beer, which is too much for a small restaurant. His plan is to sell the beer to hotels and restaurants, where he will be able to control the sales.	
	Procureur Peter Pearce questioned the security of where the alcohol would be stored. He was advised that there is a garage at the back of the premises and that it would be stored there.	
	The Assembly had no further questions, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously.	
	Tiki Co Limited La Ville Secretaries Limited (Sec)	1st & 3rd Tiki Hut 10 Wharf Street
	Proposer: Paul Bolton Seconder: Kevin Monro	
	Simon Shrive spoke on behalf of an application for 1st & 3rd ^h category licences for Tiki Hut. The licences have been held in the name of another individual, as neither he nor his wife had three years residency. Now that they had been resident in the Island for three years, they would like to be responsible for the licenses themselves. Tiki Hut is open from Monday to Thursday from 4pm to 11pm, Fridays 3pm to 11pm and at the weekend from 12noon to 11pm. There will be no change as to how the premises is currently run.

57/23	Item 3: To consider an application by Ce Soir Limited in respect of Melting Pot, 6 Caledonia Place, who hold a 1st category licence and who are applying for a 7th category licence, requiring a Bailiff's Annual Entertainment Permit, to allow an array of live entertainment until 1am, including singers, guitarists, and DJs. It is intended to host captivating music every weekend, showcasing local artists and to hold corporate and private events.
