	<p>Proposer: Adam Ewens Seconder: Jennifer Anne McMurray</p> <p>The Constable advised the Assembly of an error when making the application, the name of the company should be AE Enterprises and not AF Enterprises as advertised.</p> <p>Adam Ewens spoke on behalf of the company, explaining that he is seeking a 6th category licence to sell a range of alcohol from a small convenience store. Sandpiper Limited previously ran the store, and it has held an alcohol licence for many years. The applicant has previous experience of running an off-licence as he has held the licence for Samares Stores. The company adheres to the challenge 25 policy and staff are well versed in the licensing law.</p> <p>There were no questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>		
	Cargo Coffee Bar Limited Zevda Kumcur (Sec)	1st	Santander Work Café 13-15 Charing Cross
	<p>Proposer: Liam Montgomery Seconder: Ben Hamon</p> <p>Liam Montgomery, Director, spoke on behalf of a 1st category licence application for Santander Work Café. The company is applying for a 1st category licence to complement their current offering, they also run networking events. A 1st category licence would enable customers to stand, rather than having to be seated. There is also a planning application submitted for the café to be extended to the 2nd floor.</p> <p>Due to the sanitary provisions, Environmental Health have stipulated that there should be a maximum of 25 patrons, this wouldn’t be financially viable to the company, and they are requesting the Licensing Assembly consider the Fire Service recommendation of 135 patrons. The applicant requested that the licence be extended to cover the alfresco area.</p> <p>There were no questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously.</p>

	<p>Mike Scragg, Director of Quidsin, spoke on behalf of a 6th category off-licence application. Mr Scragg explained that Quidsin is an online voucher business, some of the vouchers sold include meals along with a glass of wine. The company has held a licence for many years but has recently moved premises, and therefore as a result is required to make a new application. Members of the public do not buy any alcohol directly from the premises.</p> <p>There were no questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously.</p>

	<p>Proposer: Ricardo Dos Santos , Seconder: George McClland</p> <p>Ricardo Dos Santos advised the Assembly that the company wished to apply for a 6th category off-licence for a small Portuguese corner shop. The Company has held a 3rd category restaurant licence for over ten years and now would like to extend their offering to a convenience store.</p> <p>There were no questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously.</p>	
	Tomuno Hospitality Limited PKF BBA Accountants (Tavola) (Sec)	<p>3rd</p> <p>Tavola 103 – 107 Central Market</p>
	<p>Proposer: Charles Renouf, Seconder: Ben Walker</p> <p>Tom Radiguet advised the Assembly that the company wished to apply for a 3rd category licence for Tavola in the Central Market, the property was formally known as La Bouche. The restaurant will adhere to the Market opening hours during the day, with the occasional Friday, Saturday, and Sunday's evenings when the Market remains open. The applicant would like the application to be extended to cover the outside alfresco area.</p> <p>Deputy Le Hegarat asked if the applicant had previous experience of running a restaurant. Mr Radiguet explained that for the past six years he has been the Executive Chef at Samphire Restaurant.</p> <p>There were no further questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>

	<p>Proposer: Nelson De Freitas, Seconder: Sandra Antunes</p> <p>Nelson De Freitas advised the Assembly that the company wished to have the restriction, that only background music be played on the premises lifted.</p> <p>Procureur Peter Pearce asked if there was any sound insulation in premises. Mr De Freitas advised that he would consider this if it was required. Presently he is requesting the restriction be lifted, so that he can make a future application for a 7th Category Licence and Bailiff's Entertainment Permit.</p> <p>There were no further questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>
