

#### **Brief introduction/summary:**

Government of Jersey's Infrastructure and Environment Officers are here today to present to Roads Committee their proposals for a proposed trial modal filter scheme at the junction of College Hill / Clarence Road / Grosvenor Street / Pleasant Street.

I&E will discuss the proposals for the Bagatelle Safer Routes to School items relating to:

- Fountain Lane trial modal filter
- College Hill / Clarence Road / Grosvenor Street / Pleasant Street trial modal filter

Subject to approval, I&E is looking to commence these 12-month trial schemes following the Easter holidays, on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> April.

With regard to the Fountain Lane scheme, I&E has liaised with the Parish of St Saviour Roads Committee who have provided initial feedback which included the section of Fountain Lane that is in Parish of St Helier ownership. The comment was that this could create a cul-de-sac and that residents may park on the road – they queried whether the Parish of St Helier may install prohibition lines.

I&E Officers will run through the proposals for a signal-controlled crossing outside Jersey College for Girls on Mont Millais, an area partially within the Parish of St Helier. Please see Appendix A for the details.

I&E Officers have submitted a planning application for the crossing relating to the widened access to the crossing on the school side, and the associated lowered wall for pedestrian visibility purposes.


Subject to Planning approval, I&E anticipates construction being programmed in the summer school holidays this year (2025), with the potential for some preparatory works in the Easter school holidays.





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

#### **Brief introduction/summary:**


At a meeting of the Roads Committee held on 10 July 2024, I&E Officers presented proposals to run a trial subsequently supported by the Committee subsequently supported.

I&E Officers have returned today to present to Roads Committee the results of the trial and to seek Committee's approval to implement the changes permanently.

In brief, I&E has undertaken an initial review of the trial and the feedback received and is happy to proceed to undertaking permanent works this year.

The next steps for I&E will be to tweak the alignment plan to suit feedback and site observations and to obtain the Committee's approval and support to the changes.

I&E will be using their Direct Labour but, in the meantime, plans to extend the trial permit until they have availability.



#### **Brief introduction/summary:**

We are seeking Roads Committee approval in principle on proposed changes to the Car Park wall in front of Belmont Gardens. This change was requested by members of the Belmont Road Neighbour Improvement Area group (NIA) and is the first improvement which the Parish can progress for the area.

We are planning to form a new exit from Belmont Gardens onto Belmont Road which will make it safer for residents in Belmont Gardens exiting with their vehicles. This will also remove the need to reverse up Belmont Gardens to exit from the existing entrance/exit onto Belmont Place.

Please note that the proposed changes will be subject to Planning permission.

The proposed plans and details can be found in Appendix A

#### Consultation:

The Parish has undertaken consultation with residents of Belmont Garden, letter was posted to all households in Belmont Gardens as the changes would impact on them more so than the wider community.

In early January we also extended the consultation to the member of the Belmont Road Neighbourhood Improvement Area mailing list. This was done via email, and it was also published on the Parish website and social media pages.

Those who responded kindly provided their addresses and we encouraged them to also speak to their neighbours to ask them to participate to the consultation.


The consultation period was run from 20 December to 20 January 2025. The full results can be found in Appendix B









#### Comments made

Below is a selection of main comments made and the two comments from those objecting to the scheme.

#### **For**

'I am wholeheartedly in favour of the proposed new exit, it will make driving in and out and parking so much easier.'

'I would support the proposal if this will be an ADDITIONAL exit and NOT replacing the existing exit/entrance that we use on Belmont Place.'

'Think this is a really good proposal'

'The only thing I would say is that I would hope the house next to the new opening have a space available to park as the proposal will increase the traffic next to theirs.'

'I have no objection to the proposed new exit, as I understand the problems Belmont Gardens residents have.'

'However, I will miss the planters and wondered if they could be moved either side of the new exit, or perhaps be replaced by smaller ones if there's not enough room.'

#### Next stage:

If approved by Roads Committee the next stages will be:

- a. Vehicle tracking and a Road Safety Audit to be undertaken to ensure the parked cars will not create an issue for exiting out of Belmont Gardens, and to address the concerns raised by those opposing the proposals so that the Parish can ensure that we have considered all comments carefully.
- b. Make the necessary adjustment to the drawing and submit for Planning permission.

#### **Against**

'No I do not agree with this proposal of an exit. I believe it looks dangerous for me and my grandchildren also the young kids living in xxx. Also the average ages of households here is 60+ You will also be opening us up to the public cars, motorbikes and pushbikes which if Belmont Road is anything to go by will use the opportunity to tear up our lane in both directions not to mention that the pavement in front of our houses are very busy with pedestrians and schoolchildren at all times of the day.'

Following the Road Safety Audit and tracking check, we will make any necessary adjustments to finalise the drawings and details and submit the Planning Application. The Parish will email all those who kindly participated with the final details ahead of submitting the Application.

Whilst the drawings are with Planning, we will obtain quotes for the works with a view to commencing shortly after obtaining Planning permission. We anticipate this will be in the next financial year and will be subject to funding being secured in 2025/26.

#### **Safety Audit level:**

Road Safety Audits will be required. Initially, a combined RSA 1 & 2 will be necessary and, once the changes have been implemented, we will follow with a level 3.

We will also undertake vehicle tracking to ensure that there is sufficient space for vehicles to safely exit.

#### **Anticipated budget cost to implement:**

We are currently awaiting costs for the Road Safety Audits and tracking; however, we would estimate in the region of £ 5k.

We will also need to submit the Panning Application which will incur costs estimated to be under  $\pounds$  1k.

#### Funding proposal:

There is funding allowed in this financial year's Roads Programme for the initial planning process.

1 Feb/March Road Safety Audit to be undertaken along with Vehicle Tracking

2 March Submission of Planning Application - anticipated to take




This photo shows the existing area unchanged, which will be the location of the proposed new exit.

Location plan indicating the approximate position of the proposed new exit




This photo shows the proposed changes needed to create the new exit from Belmont Gardens.

Change of use from beauty salon to 1No. one bedroom flat with private amenity space. Replace 1No. window with door to West elevation. Various internal and external alterations.

The Roads Committee has examined plans for the above submission and comments as follows:

1. Roads Committee notes that the application is for the change of use of the ground floor from a retail salon to a one-bedroom flat.

The existing building has no car parking.

- 2. The Applicant is to provide at least one bicycle parking space for the unit of accommodation complete with electric charging. The cycle parking space should be of sufficient size to ideally accommodate a cargo cycle. The Applicant is to be aware of the fire risk associated with electric charging batteries and ensure adequate provision is provided to address this fire risk.
- 3. That the refuse store/collection arrangements, refuse separation and recycling strategy are to be agreed in detail with the Parish Refuse Manager.
  - It should be noted that the Parish cannot collect refuse unless adequate access and storage facilities are provided on-site.
  - The Applicant is to indicate on a plan showing a properly constructed enclosure for the storage of refuse prior to collection.
  - There should be no step between the floor of the refuse store and the footway.
  - That the refuse store is fitted with a standard Parish lock.
- 4. That notwithstanding the above comments, this submission should be referred to Government's Infrastructure & Environment Department since the road in front of the property is a Government main road.

#### 2. 1, Burrard Street, St. Helier, JE2 4WS

P/2024/1492

Change of Use of 1st floor from Dental Surgery to 1no. 2-bed Residential Apartment.

The Roads Committee has examined plans for the above submission and comments as follows:

The property is located on Burrard Street and forms the corner of Rue du Funchal. The proposal is for a change of use from 1<sup>st</sup> floor dental surgery to a 2-bedroom unit of accommodation whilst the remaining units will remain unaltered, including the existing commercial unit on the ground floor.

Due to site constraints, the Applicant is not able to accommodate cycle parking within the existing building as the Roads Committee would expect to have seen at least one cycle parking space per bedroom being provided.

- 1. That the refuse store/collection arrangements, refuse separation and recycling strategy are to be agreed in detail with the Parish Refuse Manager.
  - It should be noted that the Parish cannot collect refuse unless adequate access and storage facilities are provided on-site.

- The Applicant is to indicate on a plan showing a properly constructed enclosure for the storage of refuse prior to collection.
- There should be no step between the floor of the refuse store and the footway.
- That the refuse store is fitted with a standard Parish lock.
- 2. That notwithstanding the above comments, this submission should be referred to Government's Infrastructure & Environment Department since the road in front of the property is a Government main road.

# La Rue de Trachy Pedestrian Improvements Trial Consultation Report

#### **Introduction**

In 2019 a pedestrian refuge island was installed on La Route de St. Aubin east of its junction with La Rue de Trachy. As part of the subsequent post-completion Road Safety Audit, it was identified that the adjacent La Rue de Trachy junction posed significant accessibility issues for pedestrians. In line with Departmental Policy, I&E officers explored options for improving pedestrian facilities as part of the Road Safety Audit response.



The existing La Rue de Trachy layout has no dropped kerbs or tactile paving for pedestrians, well below minimum visibility requirements for pedestrians on the eastern side and dated existing surface water drainage features.

Pedestrians also have a significant distance to cross the road (~14m) putting them at higher risk of conflict with vehicular traffic as it take longer to cross the road.

La Rue de Trachy Pedestrian Improvements Trial Consultation Report

#### **Pedestrian Trial Summary**

In July 2024, the Infrastructure and Environment (I&E) department agreed with the St. Helier Roads Committee to put in place a temporary trial at the junction of La Rue de Trachy and St. Aubin Inner Road. This trial would assess the impact of creating buildouts to the footpath at the junction to improve pedestrian accessibility and visibility. The buildouts also have the effect of reducing traffic speeds, reducing overall road risk.

The trial layout comprised of stick down plastic bollards and road markings to mimic the proposed layout. Temporary pedestrian ramps were installed to assist pushchairs, wheelchairs and those with other impairments to drop down to carriageway level and cross the road.

The trial was introduced as a temporary traffic and pedestrian management scheme which was low cost, quick to install and could be easily adjusted if required.

An I&E Poster was erected on site to inform the public of the trial and to collate any feedback.



# Rue de Trachy - Pedestrian Safety Improvements Trial

As part of the Departments work to improve road safety across the island and following requests for improved pedestrian facilities along La Route de St. Aubin, a scheme to install an uncontrolled pedestrian crossing is being brought forward.

This proposed crossing facility will help commuters and residents in the area cross the road to access local amenities.

The temporary layout currently on site mimics the extents of the proposed permanent scheme.

If the trial is successful, construction is currently planned for early 2025.

# **Trial Period Feedback**

In total, Infrastructure and Environment received feedback from five members of the public, with the common themes of these communications being summarised in the table below.

Theme of Feedback	Infrastructure & Environment Response to Feedback
Why are improvements being undertaken here?	Road safety audits of adjacent transport infrastructure have identified a distinct lack of facilities for pedestrians and specifically those with accessibility issues and visual impairments.
	Infrastructure and Environment (I&E) have a professional duty to commission road safety audits and to respond to the issues raised within those audits with a view to taking action to eliminate or at worst mitigate risk in line with the recommendations set out within the road safety audit report, whether there is a road traffic collision record or not.
Visibility at this junction is fine.	Visibility for vehicles entering and exiting the junction is compliant with current standards. However, visibility for pedestrians in certain areas is way below desirable minimums and puts pedestrians at significant risk when attempting to cross the bellmouth of La Rue de Trachy.
	The proposals would have no negative impact on existing vehicle visibility splays.
The trial is not in keeping with the surrounding area.	All the works we plan to undertake are within the highway boundary and are deemed Permitted Development under Planning and Building (General Development) (Jersey) Order 2011, Schedule 1, Part 6.
	The bollards, ramps etc used for the trial are overly conspicuous but that was the intention so it's clear to road users of the temporary arrangement.
	Any permanent works would use common highway materials such as concrete/granite kerbing, black asphalt, stainless steel bollards which are less imposing.
The narrowing of the junction is forcing drivers to slow	This is a positive change for road safety.

Will this crossing be controlled?	Signalising the junction would be excessive, and it will be intended to operate as per Rule H2 of the current Highway Code. There is also limited space for the required geometry and equipment that would be required.

Regular users of the junction with larger vehicles such as the Parish of St. Helier Refuse Collection and Jersey Post were also approached for comment on the trial.

Customer & Local Services – Disabilities & Inclusion Group were also approached for Comment on the trial and potential permanent works. They agreed that the trial with potential permanent works presented a "big improvement" to pedestrian accessibility in this area.

#### **Trial Period Conclusion**

None of the feedback received from the public presented issues which would prevent making the trial layout permanent. However, I&E Engineers did have to replace several flexible bollards as they were either struck by manoeuvring vehicles or removed by other means, indicating vehicles were struggling with certain manoeuvres. This will be considered in the final design.

In conclusion, the Department recognise that the trial buildout on the eastern side of La Rue de Trachy has opportunity for further improvement and are open to refining the final design to ensure it remains functional while continuing to provide significant benefits to pedestrians.

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#### **Proposed Permanent Works**

Below is a summary of the Advantages and Disadvantages of making the trial permanent.

<u>Advantages</u>	<u>Disadvantages</u>
Undertaking permanent works would create an accessible crossing point for pedestrians and vulnerable road users which has safer visibility splays for all road users.	The footway buildout on the eastern side potentially limits left turns for larger vehicles out of Rue de Trachy onto La Route de St. Aubin. Such as large delivery lorries.  Larger vehicles wishing to head east from Rue de Trachy do have the option to turn right onto La Route de St. Aubin and use La
	Rue de Galet and Victoria Avenue as an alternative.
There is scope to undertake significant improvements to the surface water drainage at this location, reducing splashing to pedestrians.	
The proposed changes present an improved walking link to nearby attractions and amenities in line with Government Policy.	
Narrowing of the junction acts as Traffic Calming for vehicles entering La Rue de Trachy, especially entry speeds off La Route de St. Aubin (West).	
The proposed changes have no impact on existing Road Traffic Orders, representing a low cost and deliverable improvement.	
All works would be within the Highway Boundary and can be undertaken under Permitted Development rights of the Highway Authority.	

It is proposed that an amended version of the trial is made permanent as soon as reasonably practicable. This would mitigate the impact on left turning vehicles whilst still providing an enhanced, safer facility for pedestrians.

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
