	Proposer: Florin Aranda Seconder: William Davey David Voisin spoke on behalf of the company, explaining that they had recently purchased the premises, Seafood Cafe which had held a 3rd category licence. The front of the premises is to remain a takeaway fish and chip shop, whilst the rear of the premises that opens into Liberty Wharf, is to become a bar restaurant, requiring 1st and 3rd category licences. Mr Voisin asked for the licences to be extended to cover an outside area within the Liberty Wharf complex. Chef de Police, Danny Scaife asked what time the premises would close. Mr Voisin confirmed it would close at 11pm. There were no further questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously

	Proposer: Nelson De Freitas, Seconder: Alison Baker Nelson De Freitas, spoke on behalf of a 7th category licence application for The Kings Bar. The company is applying for a 7th category licence to provide entertainment on a Friday and at the weekend. The bar provides a seating service only. Chef de Police, Danny Scaife asked if the premises would remain open until 1am, and if so, does it employ door staff. Mr De Freitas confirmed that was the plan on Fridays and Saturdays, and door staff are employed on these evenings. Deputy Ahier asked if they would be playing music until 1am. Mr De Freitas confirmed that the music would cease after midnight, which would provide less than an hour for people to drink up and be out of the premises. There were no further questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously.

	<p>Proposer: Francisco Loro Reina Seconder: Karen Bertram</p> <p>Francisco Loro Reina advised the Assembly that the company wished to apply for a 3rd category licence for Arroz. The restaurant will be Spanish, serving tapas etc. The applicant asked for the licence to be extended to cover a chose publique alfresco area.</p> <p>There were no questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>

	<p>Proposer: Gill Rees, Seconder: Sarah Correia</p> <p>Salvatore La Ragione advised the Assembly that the company wished to apply for 3rd and 6th category licences for La Bottega in the Central Market. The restaurant hopes to bring something different to the Market and requested the licence be extended to cover an outside area within the market complex.</p> <p>Chef de Police, Danny Scaife asked if the 6th category licence was for deliveries. Mr La Ragione explained that alcohol deliveries would be of beer and wine only.</p> <p>There were no further questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>

	<p>Proposer: Francis Gerald Voisin, Seconder: Patricia Chard</p> <p>Francis Gerald Voisin advised the Assembly that the company wished to apply for a 3rd category licence for the existing restaurant on the 3rd floor. The restaurant has been in operation for many years, the reason for the application is to bring the licence back into Voisins Limited.</p> <p>There were no questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>	
24/25	<p>Item 3: To consider an application for a Bailiff's Entertainment Permit (P49) by Bond Hotel Limited, in respect of premises known as The Kings Bar, 14 Bond Street, who already hold a 1st category licence and who are applying for a 7th category licence. The application is for entertainment which would be a duo or trio, piano and/or guitar. This type of entertainment would be held on Fridays and Saturdays.</p>

25/25	<p>Item 4: To consider an application by The Pavillion Restaurant Limited, current holder of 1st and 3rd category licences, for The Pavillion, Liberation Place, The Esplanade; to extend the sale of alcohol for their 3rd Category Restaurant Licence to Monday to Saturday (inclusive) between 9am to midnight; and</p>	

	Sunday, Good Friday and Christmas Day between 11am and midnight.
	<p>Proposer: Kate Godfrey, Seconder: Sebastian Kiernicki</p> <p>Kate Godfrey advised the Assembly that the company had been running The Pavilion for over two years. The application is to extend the licence to accommodate events, predominately on Fridays and Saturdays.</p> <p>Deputy Ahier questioned the hours the premises would be open over the Christmas period. Miss Godfrey confirmed the premises normally closes over the Christmas period.</p> <p>There were no further questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>
26/25	<p>Item 5: To consider an application for a Bailiff's Entertainment Permit (P49) by The Pavillion Restaurant Limited, in respect of premises known as The Pavillion, Liberation Place, The Esplanade, who hold 1st and 3rd category licences. The application is for events which take place inside the premises from Monday to Saturday, 5pm to 1am, and there shall be no more than 3 occasions a month with music or activities which are covered by the permit . The entertainment will take the form of a DJ or small band.</p>
	<p>Proposer: Kate Godfrey, Seconder: Sebastian Kiernicki</p> <p>Kate Godfrey advised the Assembly that the company would like to apply for a Bailiff's Entertainment Permit (P49) to hold small private events incorporating small bands.</p> <p>There were no questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>
27/25	<p>Item 6: To consider an application by A De Gruchy & Co Limited, in respect of premises known as A De Gruchy & Co, 50-52 King Street, holder of a 6th category licence . The application is to amend the conditions of the current licence, stating alcohol will only be sold in gift packs between 1st October and 28th February, to alcohol can be sold as separate items on a year-round basis.</p>
	<p>Proposer: Simon Youden, Seconder: Darren Huelin</p> <p>Paul Mulliner advised the Assembly that the company wished to amend their 6th category licence, to permit them to support local businesses by selling alcohol individually and on a year-round basis.</p> <p>There were no questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously</p>
