26/18	<b>Item 1: to recommend to the Licensing Assembly an ex-parte application by Samphire Limited (formerly Ormer Restaurant Limited) holder of First &amp; Third Category licences in respect of Ormer Restaurant, 7-11 Don Street to extend the First Category licence to cover the adjacent premises at 13 Don Street:</b>									
	<p>Proposer: Paul Dransfield Seconder: Nicos Makariou</p> <p>Simon Hurry of Collas Crill presented the application explaining that following a number of changes to the company name the company Samphire Ltd was looking to extend the first category licence held for 7-11 Don Street over the ground floor of the adjacent premises at 13 Don Street. Until recently, the premises had operated as the Deli but the company was looking to re-brand the premises as “Street” and different interesting food and premium drinks from all around the world would be served for consumption on &amp; off the premises. It was envisaged that the operating hours initially would be between 11am &amp; 11pm and the company would monitor how things progress as it may be an earlier closing time may be required.</p> <p>Geraint Jennings queried why it was an extension of the first category and not an application for a specific licence solely for those premises.</p> <p>Simon Hurry confirmed that there would be access between Ormer &amp; Street so there would be interchange between the two premises, so an extension of the first category felt more appropriate.</p> <p>Mr Jennings asked if that meant the premium drinks on sale at Street would also be served in Ormer and vis versa.</p> <p>It was confirmed that this would be the case.</p> <p>Peter Pearce said that to a passer-by it would appear that these would be two separate entities therefore would there be list of the products on sale and the prices outside each premise.</p> <p>Mr Hurry confirmed that there would.</p> <p><b>On being put to the vote the application was approved unanimously</b></p>

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	<p>category entertainment licence in June last year but due to a misunderstanding the company had forgotten to renew the licence when it renewed the others in 2017. It was therefore re-applying for it and that the conditions attached when it was granted would be maintained.</p> <p>Geraint Jennings asked for clarification that this application is solely for 7-11 Don Street and not covering 13 Don Street.</p> <p>Simon Hurry confirmed that the application would only apply to the first floor of 7-11 Don Street.</p> <p>Mr Jennings added but the application form also mentions the ground floor.</p> <p>Mr Hurry confirmed that as well as applying for the seventh category the company also held a P49 Bailiffs entertainment permit which meant certain entertainment could be provided on the ground floor without holding a seventh category licence for that part of the premises.</p> <p>Peter Pearce said he understood that you could get to the first floor from the restaurant, but added that if there was a separate entrance would a separate pricing be displayed.</p> <p>It was confirmed that it would.</p> <p><b>On being put to the vote, application was approved unanimously</b></p> <p><b>The Constable informed those present that the applications would be heard by the Licensing Assembly at 10:00am on Thursday 22 March 2018</b></p>
