	<p>The Constable asked if there were any nominations from the Assembly to fill the one Youth vacancy on the Shadow Conseil Municipal. Unfortunately, no nominations were received and so the Youth vacancy will remain unfilled and be brought back to the Assembly in 2020.</p> <p>The Constable asked if there were any nominations from the Assembly to fill the remaining four vacancies on the Shadow Conseil Municipal, the following nominations were received:</p> <p>Edward (Ted) Vibert – proposed by Deputy Mike Higgins seconded by Deputy Stephen Ahier</p> <p>Malcolm L’Amy – proposed Mary Osmond seconded by Sam Osmond</p> <p>Lyndsay Feltham – proposed by Julian Rogers seconded by Eduardo Humanes</p> <p>Barbara Corbett – proposed by Katherine Hayes seconded by Elizabeth Guise</p> <p>Jason Lagadu – proposed by Gino Risoli seconded by Geraint Jennings</p> <p>Mario Pirozzolo – proposed by Edward (Ted) Vibert seconded by John Baker</p> <p>James (Noel) Flood – proposed by Mervyn Jones seconded by Geraint Jennings</p> <p>Following a three minute speech by each candidate as to their experience, what they would bring as a member of the Shadow Conseil Municipal and a 20 minute question and answer session, where members of the Assembly asked candidates their views on a broad range of subjects; including tackling town traffic and congestion; the Island Plan and proposed development in St Helier’, the candidates’ portfolio preferences; arts, heritage and culture in the Parish and the future of the Fort Regent; the Constable announced that there being seven candidates for the four vacancies a secret ballot would be held. 66/19	Item 3: To receive the plan for the Parish to aim to be carbon-neutral by 2025/30, as agreed by the Parish Assembly on 27 March 2019
	<p>Proposer: Deputy Rob Ward, Seconder: John Baker</p> <p>The Constable asked the Assembly to receive the plan for the Parish to aim to be carbon-neutral by 2025/30, as agreed by the Parish Assembly on 27 March 2019. The Constable stated he felt it important that the Parish bring the report back within the agreed timeframe. However, he was conscious that the draft report had only recently been circulated to the Climate Change Emergency Working Group and that they have had little time to digest the content and make any comments or amendments. It is planned to call a meeting of the Working Group in early January to go through the report and make any revisions. Questions or comments were invited from the Assembly.</p> <p>John Baker stated that as a member of the Working Group he gave the report his support, he had worked alongside other Parishes in relation to Climate Change and found the report, to be produced to a good standard and was impressed the Parish had come back in the agreed time frame. He applauded the group and Parish employees for their work.</p> <p>Another member of the Working Group stated that he and had attended all the meetings; he praised the Parish staff for bringing the report together.</p> <p>The Assembly unanimously agreed to receive the report</p>
