The Vingtaine:

The Community de la Vingtaine de la Ville dates back to at least the 17th century. It is separate from the Vingtaine de la Ville, which forms part of the Parish of St Helier. It origin was as the community of proprietors who enjoyed rights in common on Mont de la Ville. In 1804 it received a capital sum for cancellation of those rights before the construction of Fort Regent. Its status is as a customary law company with separate legal personality and perpetual succession. Its proprietors are owners of or mandataires of corporate owners of immovable property in the Vingtaine.

REPORT OF THE PROCUREURS

The Procureurs are delighted to present to the Proprietors the Community's annual accounts for the year ended 31 December 2024. Under its Regulations the Community should appoint two Procureurs and hold annual Assemblies. In June 2024 it was summonsed to appear before the Royal Court to respond to a Representation from the Attorney General.

With the assistance of the Parish, an Assembly of Proprietors was held on 26 November 2024 when accounts covering the years ended 31 December 2016 to 31 December 2023 were approved. John Baker and Peter Hargreaves were elected the Procureurs, replacing David Letto.

John, the mandataire of a corporate Proprietor, is also a Procureur of the Parish of St Helier. Peter is mandataire of the Societe Jersiaise, which is an owner of property in the Vingtaine and considers its aims complementary to those of the Community.

The Procureurs wish to extend their thanks to David Letto for his years of service to the Community.

Since being appointed, the Procureurs have taken steps to bring the Community's affairs up-to-date:

- Its funds are once more held on interest-earning accounts.
- It has been registered as a not-for-profit organisation.

OTAL BAVOR.

- It was unable to register as a charity under the existing Charities Law but has been told that the Law will be changed so that it can register in future.
- Attempts to recover an amount equivalent to the interest not received during the period funds were held on non-interest earning accounts have been unsuccessful.
- There was an annual charge for preparing and reporting on the accounts covering the period 2016-23.
 The Procureurs are now preparing the accounts themselves and are grateful to Leslie Norman for acting as unremunerated reporting accountant.
- A new plaque has been installed, the first for a number of years.
- In 1989 the Community became the owner of the largest part of Allix's Shipyard at Havre des Pas. In 2001 it was renovated to form a garden and space of tranquillity, with structures and plaques referring to its former role as a shipyard. It is now in need of repair and maintenance. The costs involved exceed the funds remaining to the Community. In these circumstances, it is now proposed transferring ownership of the Shipyard to the Parish of St Helier, on the basis that the Parish would maintain the area in its current condition for an extended period and bear the costs of its repair and maintenance. The Parish has agreed to bear the Community's legal costs for the transfer which continues the tradition of the Community contributing to the enhancement of St Helier's urban fabric over the past 220 years.
- In June 2025 the Royal Court confirmed that the matters raised in the Representation by the Attorney General had been successfully concluded.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified by the annual revaluation of investments, and in accordance with accounting policies as adopted by the Vingtaine.

A summary of the more important accounting policies which have been adopted consistently is set out below.

1.2 Income and expenses

Income is accounted for on a receipts basis, while expenses are accounted for on an accruals basis.

1.3 Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated on the balance sheet at cost or valuation.

1.4 Investments

Investments are stated in the accounts at their market value at the year end value, the unrealised appreciation or depreciation having been taken to the investment revaluation reserve account. Vingtaine bank notes are included at the Procureurs' valuation.
