41/26	Item 1: To approve the Minutes of the Parish Assembly held on 27 May 2026
	Proposer: Procureur James Corbett Seconder: Procureur Peter Pearce The minutes were adopted
42/26	Item 2: Recommend to the Licensing Assembly an application by Matthew John Daly, holder of a 3rd Category licence in respect of Luma Cafe, 25 Halkett Street to vary the conditions of the licence to remove the restriction that only background music shall be played on the said premises.
	Proposer: Samantha Morely Seconder: Lucie Marie Holt Matthew Daly spoke on behalf of an application for Luma Café. He explained that the business would like to apply for a P49 Bailiff's Entertainment Permit, but before the application can be considered, the condition that only background music can be played on the premises needs to be removed. Centenier Scaife asked the applicant to confirm if there are any residential premises above or near the premises. Mr Daly explained that it is only businesses in the surrounding area. Procureur Corbett asked could the applicant be more specific regarding how often entertainment would be provided, was it occasional or regular. Mr Daly stated that whilst it wouldn't be every week, he didn't want to restrict the application further. There were no further questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously.
43/26	Item 3: To consider an application by Matthew John Daly, holder of a 3rd category licence in respect of Luma Cafe, 25 Halkett Street to apply for a Bailiff's Annual Entertainment Permit, to allow solo musicians only, such as a DJ or acoustic guitarist. Entertainment will take place no more than once a week and in the vast majority of cases at weekends (Friday or Saturday). These will be closed door functions e.g. birthday parties, within the permitted hours of the permit.
	Proposer: Samantha Morely Seconder: Lucie Marie Holt Matthew Daly spoke on behalf of an application for Luma Café. The business would like to apply for a P49 Bailiff's Entertainment Permit. Entertainment will take place no more than once a week and in most cases at weekends (Friday or Saturday). The Assembly were assured that any events would be closed door functions e.g. birthday parties. The sound system has been trialled, and no noise could be heard from the street. The business is operating as a café and is not intended to be a music venue. A member of the Assembly enquired why the applicant was only requesting a permit for music once a week. Mr Daly stated then when applying for the permit, the authorities had advised him to be specific. There were no further questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously.
