	Laura Rosser	3rd	The Beach Hut Café Pinel Slip Layby No.6 Victoria Avenue
	Proposer: Paula Pires Seconder: Sinead Barry The Constable advised the Assembly, that the application would only progress on the proviso that the alfresco area received agreement from the Government Infrastructure Department. Laura Rosser addressed the Assembly regarding a 3rd category licence application for The Beach Hut Café. She explained that the seating area is an outside alfresco area, the business is seeking a liquor licence to add to the services they already provide. If the business is not granted the licence in time for this season, then when granted they will be able to proceed immediately next year. Procureur Pearce asked the measurements of the alfresco area. Miss Rosser advised that the area would be roped off, it was approximately 10 meters and accommodated several picnic tables, each seating six people. A similar example is the Lookout Café, also located on Victoria Avenue. There were no further questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously		
54/26	Item 4: To consider an application by Laura Rosser in respect of The Beach Hut Café, Pinel Slip, Layby No. 6, Victoria Avenue to apply for a Bailiff's Annual Entertainment (P49) Permit, to allow acoustic live music, Balearic DJ music, quiz nights and children's entertainment, to take place three times per week during the summer to autumn season, along with a couple of Christmas events. All events would conclude no later than 10pm.		
	Proposer: Paula Pires Seconder: Sinead Barry Laura Rosser explained she was seeking a Bailiff's Entertainment (P49) Permit for the Beach Hut Café. Entertainment would take place three nights per week and would cease no later than 10pm. Procureur Corbett stated that having looked at the plan, how was the applicant going to ensure that the entertainment didn't impact residents' homes on the far side of Victoria Avenue. Laura Rosser explained that		

	several residents were already customers of the Beach Hut, and that they had requested entertainment. She explained that there would be no loud music, as it was not a music event. The entertainment would be chilled and create a beach club vibe; it wouldn't be rave or have a loud bass. There were no further questions from the Assembly, on being put to a vote the application was approved unanimously
