Welcome!

We are pleased to introduce a new virtual exhibition space for the Havre des Pas Coastal Flood Alleviation Scheme. This evolving digital platform has been designed to keep Islanders informed and involved as the project progresses.



What is the Virtual Exhibition Space?

This online space provides a dedicated digital environment for the project where you can:

- ❖ Explore the proposed coastal defence scheme.
- ❖ View plans, early designs, and visualisations.
- ❖ Access project documents, reports, and background information.
- ❖ Learn about the history, environment, and character of Havre des Pas.
- ❖ Stay informed as the project develops.

It brings together a wide range of information into one accessible location, available anytime.

Why we've created it

The Havre des Pas scheme is a significant, long-term project to improve protection against coastal flooding while enhancing the seafront for the community.

This virtual space has been created to support:

- ❖ **Transparency** – making information easy to access
- ❖ **Public engagement** – helping people understand and respond to proposals
- ❖ **Ongoing communication** – providing a central place for updates as designs evolve

What is currently available

Scheme Visualisations (Early Concepts)

A series of pre-concept visualisations showing how different parts of the coastline could evolve:

- **Frontage 1 - La Collette Gardens**
Extension of the seafront with new public spaces and landscaped gardens
- **Frontage 2 - Promenade West**
A wider promenade, new sea wall, and improved walking and cycling routes
- **Frontage 3 - Promenade East**
Enhanced flood defences and a wider, high-quality waterfront
- **Frontage 4 - La Grève d'Azette**
Improved sea defences with promenade corridor and cycle route, with this area being designed acknowledging a more residential setting in this area

These visuals illustrate early ideas only and will continue to evolve as the design progresses.

Project Documents and Reports

Key documents currently available include:

- Consultation Project Information
- Public Consultation Report (2025)
- Stakeholder Workshop Report (2024)
- Public Realm Vision.
- Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Local Heritage and Environment Information

The space also includes contextual information to help users understand the wider setting, including:

- Historic features such as Martello Tower, slipways, and the bathing pool
- Cultural history, including shipbuilding and coastal use over time
- Environmental designations such as geological sites and the Ramsar coastline

This helps explain how the scheme will respond to Havre des Pas's unique heritage and natural environment.

A platform in development

This is an early-stage edition of the virtual exhibition and it will continue to grow.

Future updates will include:

- More detailed and refined designs.
- Additional visualisations and interactive content.
- Construction information and timelines.
- Further consultation materials and feedback opportunities.
- Portal for Newsletters.

Our aim is to develop this into the “go-to” digital hub for the project.

The virtual exhibition will be accessible via the Government of Jersey website alongside other project information:

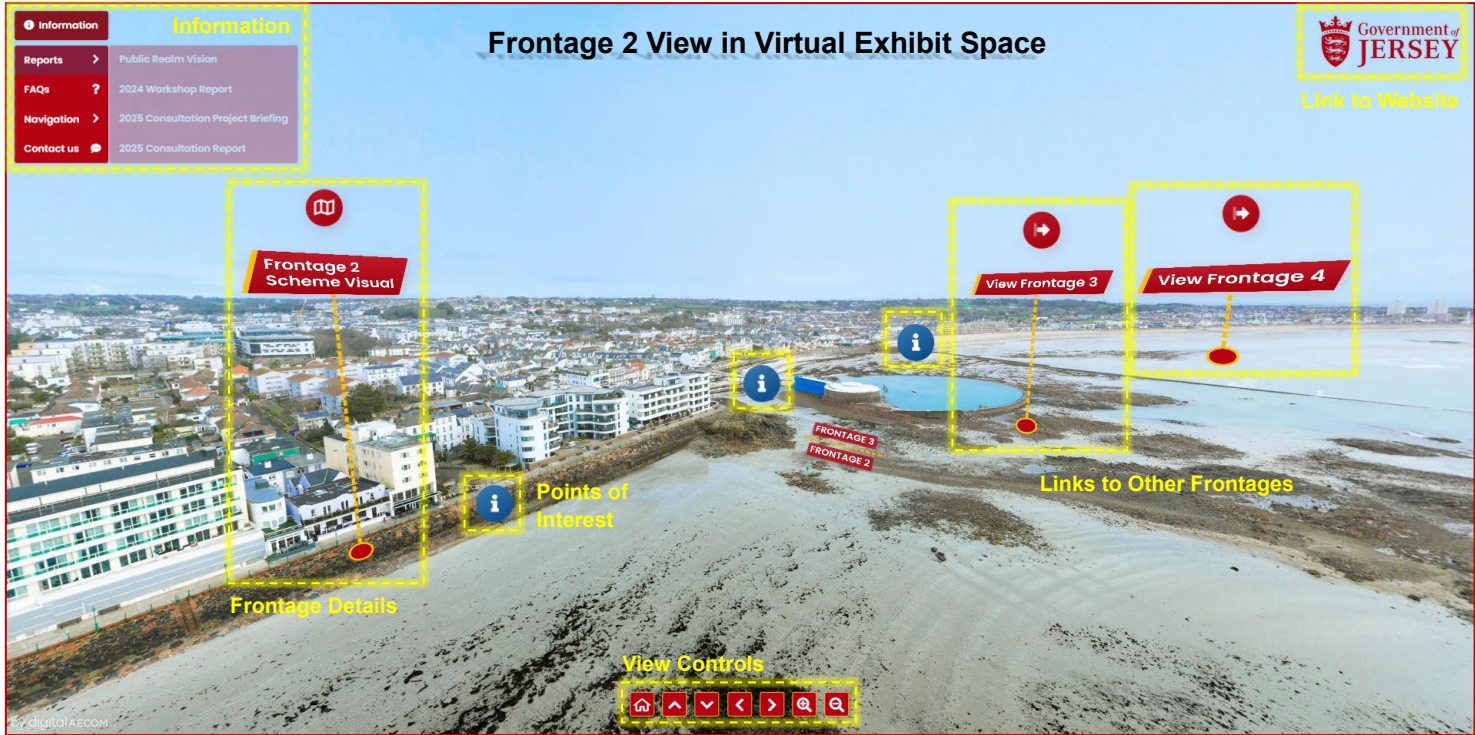

Using the Virtual Exhibition

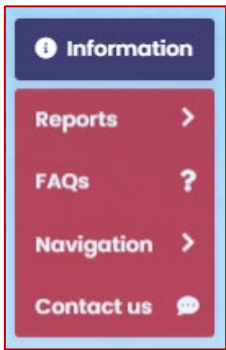


Exploring the Virtual Environment

The virtual exhibition can be viewed on desktop computers, tablets and mobile devices.

To explore the virtual environment:

- Click and drag with your mouse, or swipe on a touchscreen device, to look around the panoramic view.
- Explore the full 360-degree environment to view the scheme from different perspectives.
- Use the navigation controls at the bottom of the screen to move around the exhibition, return to the home view and zoom in or out.



Information Menu

Select the Information button located in the top-left corner of the screen to access:

- Project reports and supporting documents.
- Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs).
- The Scheme Map (via Navigation).
- Links to different frontage locations.
- Other project information.

Selecting Reports will display a list of available documents which can be opened or downloaded.

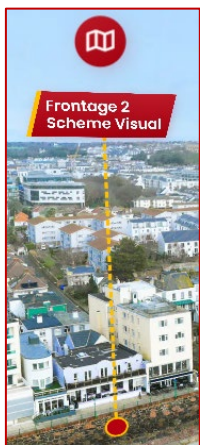


Scheme Map

The Scheme Map provides an overview of the project and shows:

- The overall extent of the scheme.
- The locations of individual frontages.
- The location of information points and interactive features throughout the exhibition.

The map is a useful tool for understanding the overall project to aid navigating areas of interest.



Scheme Visuals

Throughout the exhibition you will see frontage markers identified by a red map icon and frontage title, such as **Frontage 2 Scheme Visual**.

When you move your cursor over one of these icons, a short description will appear explaining the feature.

Selecting the frontage marker opens additional information which may include:

- Drawings.
- Visualisations.
- Technical information.
- Supporting documents.



Points of Interest

Blue information icons identify Points of Interest within the exhibition.

These currently provide information about:

- Historic locations.
- Historic features.
- Heritage assets.
- Local environmental and cultural information.

Hovering over an icon displays a brief description, while selecting the icon opens further information.



Moving Between Frontages

To move quickly between different areas of the scheme, use the **View Frontage** navigation markers.

Selecting one of these markers will transport you directly to the chosen frontage, allowing you to explore the scheme location by location.

Contact Information

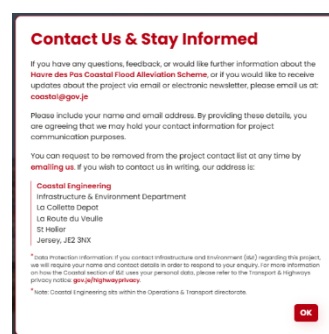
If you have any questions or would like further information, select the **Contacts** section within the exhibition to access project contact details.
